MINISTRY OF CIVIL AVIATION MONTHLY SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF JANUARY, 2016

1. Important Policy decisions taken and major achievements during the month:

Passengers carried by domestic airlines during January-December, 2015 were **<u>810.91 lakhs</u>** as against **<u>673.83 lakhs</u>** during the corresponding period of previous year thereby registering a **growth of 20.34%**.

Consultation with various stakeholders has been carried out on Draft National Civil Aviation Policy, released on 30th October 2015 including Consultative Committee of the Ministry of Civil Aviation. The feedback has been received and the policy is being finalized on the basis of feedback. The objective of the Draft Civil Aviation Policy is to provide safe, secure, affordable and maintainable air travel with access to various parts of India and world with an objective of enhanced regional connectivity, ease of doing business and promote entire aviation sector chain from Cargo, general aviation, aerospace manufacturing to skill development.

- New Terminal Building with a capacity to handle 600 peak hour passenger at a time and constructed at a cost of Rs. 91 crores at Khajuraho Airport was formally inaugurated by the Hon'ble Minister of Civil Aviation and Hon'ble Chief Minister of Madhya Pradesh on 23rd January, 2016.
- ASMGCS(05): Installation at Lucknow completed.
- C-ATFM: TMU installation at Mangalore and Varanasi Completed. Testing of AOCC completed.

(iv) Commission of Railway Safety (CRS):-

During the month of <u>January, 2016</u>, No serious accident occurred during the month.
