Detailed Monthly information for the month of June, 2020

Important Policy decisions taken and major achievements during the month:

1. MINISTRY OF CIVIL AVIATION

A. Essential medical supplies airlifted from overseas:

Governmental procurements of medicals supplies were air lifted by different airlines on charter basis. As of 30 June 2020, about 1,400 gross tonnes (2,100 vol. weight) have been airlifted by mounting 72 charter flights of Air India and Indian freighter operators.

B. Airlifting agri-produce for better value realization for farmers:

In the first quarter of FY 2020-21 (April-June) as per initial data received, total agricultural exports estimated at 20,368 MT were achieved through specific facilitation despite lockdown conditions. Domestically, agricultural cargo uplifted at origin airport is estimated at 7,519 MT. The total agricultural air cargo uplift thus works out to 27,887 MT. A number of new products, new suppliers, and new destinations were added, which included export of "Langra, Chausa, and Banarasi" mangoes to London on 14-06-2020 for the first time. Initiatives are envisaged to sustain and scale up this initiative.

C. Promotion of India as a Transshipment Hub

In June 2020, (a) via Chennai Airport, the first transshipment operations between two foreign country supplier (China) and consignee (Chad, Africa) *on an Indian dedicated freighter* took place; (b) the *Land-Air* Pilot Project on transshipment cargo from Kolkata Airport (from Bangladesh to abroad via Petrapole) has been regularized by Department of Revenue based on a proposal from MoCA; and (c) the first *Land-Air* transshipments involving agricultural produce (Varanasi-Lucknow-Delhi-Dubai, Muzaffarpur-Patna-Bengaluru/Delhi/Chennai/Mumbai, Muzaffarpur-Kolkata-Abu Dhabi, etc.) were taken up.

D. Government of India, in exercise of the powers conferred under Rule 160 of the Aircraft Rules, 1937, has granted "Conditional Exemption from the provisions of the Rule 15A to various State owned entities for use of drones. The details are as under:

- (i) Vide Order dated 02.06.2020, this Ministry has accorded conditional exemption to Maharashtra State Electricity Transmission Co Ltd for Power Line inspection using drones.
- (ii) In order to facilitate the identification of civil drones and drone operators, another opportunity for voluntary disclosure of such drones and drone operators has been provided to persons in possession of drones vide Public Notice dated 08.06.2020 through the DigiSky platform, wherein a Drone Acknowledgement Number (DAN) and Ownership Acknowledgement Number (OAN) are generated instantly on successful uploading of the required information.
- (iii) Survey of India has been granted exemption vide Order dated 11.06.2020 for large scale mapping of inhabited areas of villages using drones under Central Sector Scheme "SVAMITVA".

- (iv) This Ministry has given relaxation to Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers' Welfare on 27.06.2020 for use of engine powered Remotely Piloted Aircraft System and night operations for anti-locust operations.
- (v) Requisite assistance was provided to Ministry of Agriculture for engaging helicopters into anti-locust operations in the State of Rajasthan. The helicopter operation was launched by Hon'ble Agriculture Minister, Government of India on 30.06.2020.

2. DIRECTOR GENERAL OF CIVIL AVIATION (DGCA)

- A.** The following Regulations in important areas have been issued/revised by DGCA during the month of June, 2020:
- (i) Amendment: - CAR Section 2, Series F, Part - I, Rev. 9, dated 15th June, 2020 related to Recording of Irrevocable De-registration and Export Request Authorization (IDERA) with DGCA the IDERA holder or his authorized signatory or certified designee of the authorized signatory shall submit application as per Appendix B. Further, for de-registration of an aircraft under sub-rule 7 of Rule 30 of the Aircraft Rules, 1937, the IDERA holder will file a request with DGCA as per AIC 12/2018. This CAR has been reviewed and revised in line with the latest Article 16 of the Cape Town Convention and rules.
 - (ii) Amendment: - CAR Section 2, Series X, Part-VII, Rev. 7, dated 12th June, 2020 related to document carry on board of the aircraft. No person in charge of any aircraft shall allow such aircraft to be flown unless valid documents carrying on board those mentioned in this CAR. Further few documents such as Current comprehensive insurance policy covering passengers and their baggage, crew, third party risks, hull loss are been included in this CAR. This CAR has been reviewed and revised in line with the latest Rule and Regulation.
 - (iii) Issued: - CAR -145, issue -02, Rev. 4 dated 12th June, 2020 This CAR has been amended to harmonise with amended CAR M and with the latest revisions of EASA Part 145 and in line with the latest Rules and regulations.
 - (iv) Issued: - CAR M, issue -2, Rev.3 dated 12th June, 2020 This CAR has been amended to harmonise with the EASA Commission Regulation (EU) 2018/1142 dated 16/08/2018 and in line with the latest Rules and regulations.
