Detailed Monthly information for the month of July, 2018

Important Policy decisions taken and major achievements during the month:

1. Ministry of Civil Aviation

- A. Passengers carried by domestic airlines during Jan-June, 2018 were **684.83 lakhs** as against **561.55 lakhs** during the corresponding period of previous year thereby registering a growth of **21.95%**.
- B. Bilateral talks were held between Government of India and Government of Philippines in Manila on 11-12th July, 2018, wherein the old ASA of 1949 was modernized and inter-alia, third country code share accepted. Designated carriers of Philippines can now operate a maximum of 28 frequencies per week from Delhi, Mumbai, Kolkata & Chennai and unlimited operation to/from 18 Indian tourist destinations.
